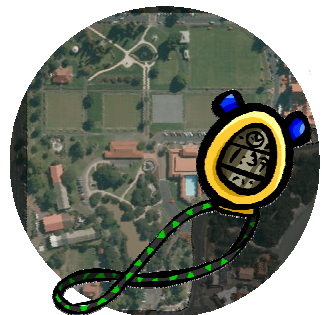
All bookings must be made through Rotorua Museum education staff. An additional charge applies for the Amazing Race for non-Rotorua residents.

27 March - 13 April 2017

Swirling colour and movement transforms an artwork into a work full of energy and intrigue.

Across at the Rotorua Children's Art House students will learn about Vincent van Gogh and how he used paint strokes in an innovative way to create memorable scenes.

In this hands-on session, using Vincent van Gogh's slash method, students will to create their own dynamic artwork with pastels.

Tourism Development In Rotorua

Geography NCEA L3. Supports achievement standard 91427

A Cultural Process – Tourism Development

Demonstrate understanding of how a cultural process shapes a geographic environment.

Students will receive an interactive, relevant and engaging talk while learning about tourism development.

This will summarise the birth of tourism at the Pink and White Terraces and the effects of the Mt Tarawera eruption in 1886. It will cover the diversification and advancement of the township and the attempt at catalytic development by the Government in constructing the Bath House. The talk will also explore the mass development phase and specialisation of tourism in recent years.

Museum staff will highlight the impact that social, political, economic, natural and technological elements have on the environment of Rotorua.

Suitable for Year 3 - 10

Sulphur Science (Introducing Geothermal)

Be a scientist and discover how geothermal activity is produced and why it occurs in the Rotorua region.

This hands-on session will have children testing, recording, comparing and analysing geothermal activity in and around Sulphur Point and Government Gardens.

ROTORUA SETTLERS & STEAM MUSEUM

Investigate what everyday life was like in the late 1880s to early 1900s. Students will experience the homes, shops and chores common to the time. Objects and technologies from the period will be used to make butter, do the washing, explore what a blacksmith did and examine how a steam engine worked.

Special conditions and costs apply. Entry to Steam Museum \$2 per child and per accompanying adult. Teachers free of charge. Unfortunately the Museum Bus can not be used for this programme
