Lost or missing student	<ul> <li>Teachers are to disclose to students that there will be members of the public within some of the spaces we visit.</li> <li>Ensure the suggested ratio is clear to visiting teachers and that an adult is assigned to student groups.</li> <li>The class teacher is responsible for the overall safety of all students</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Teacher to do a register check</li> <li>Museum and teaching staff to search building</li> <li>Notify museum director of situation</li> <li>Contact Police</li> </ul>
Evacuation of building	<ul> <li>Teachers are to inform students and adult helpers at the start of the visit the procedure in the event of an emergency.</li> <li><u>Class teachers must bring a class list/roll</u>.</li> <li>Disclose that the assembly point in the event of an evacuation is in front of building.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Follow practiced evacuation procedure.</li> <li>Evacuate out the closest fire exit to the evacuation point in front of the Energy Events Centre main entrance</li> </ul>
Leaving the group	• Museum staff will let students and teachers know the conditions of using the Energy Events Centre. Access for the group is restricted to the main foyer as a thoroughfare and the conference rooms in use. Students are not to linger or enter other areas.	<ul> <li>Visiting school staff have prior warning and know at all times where their students are</li> </ul>
Going to the toilet	• Disclose to students and teachers that any student going to the toilet or leaving the main group for what ever reason must be accompanied by an adult.	<ul> <li>Visiting school staff have prior warning and know at all times where their students are</li> <li>Toilet Facilities are located on the ground floor of the building.</li> </ul>

#### Meet & Greet:

- To the at the <u>front entrance</u> is an assembly area for your group
- Our education staff will begin the session by meeting and greeting you all outside
- Education staff will let you know if there is anything you need to bring along
- We welcome adult helpers and encourage them to have an active role in the learning programme

#### **Buses & Parking**

- Please unload and load your students at the front entrance
- Bus parking is allocated close by as this area has restricted parking
- For other vehicles parking in the Government Gardens is free and there are places available at the front of the building

- The entrance provides shelter whilst waiting for your educator to join you
- If your programme is Sulphur Science, Horohopu -Maori Games or Amazing Race we will contact you the day before to discuss options for your programme . In most cases we can still cater for you although activities may vary
