Rotorua Museum aims to bring youth from our community together that have an interest in the arts, museums and/or history. This Rotorua Museum Youth Group will support the Museum in an advisory role and youth involved will also have the opportunity to learn more about museums, the arts and history.

This is a great opportunity for youth from our communities, who are genuinely interested in museums, history or art to contribute their ideas and feedback, for Te Whare Taonga o Te Arawa. In return, the youth involved will:

- · Get to be the Museum representative(s) for their school/ tertiary provider/ lwi.
- Get to have fun, whilst connecting with other youth from our community who have similar interests (museums, history or art etc).
- Get to have their say on matters related to the Museum and know their voice has been heard.
- · Create networks for potential future employment in a museum/arts career pathway.
- Be offered learning opportunities with Museum staff and access to the Pātaka (Artefact Storeroom).

#### This may lead to:

- Getting invited to specific Museum events and openings.
- Being offered work experience in a museum setting, as well as experience in museum events and programmes.
- Getting a reference from Rotorua Museum for a Curriculum Vitae or for entrance to University/ Tertiary studies.
- Potentially, being offered casual/part-time employment for the Museum.

This group will be made up of youth from our community and will meet regularly (1-2 x per term) to share their feedback, ideas and advice for our Museum, from a youth perspective. Local high schools, tertiary providers and lwi groups will be offered the opportunity to send along 1-2 of their students/youth to be a part of this group.
